



Synopsis

When Frederic was a young boy, his nurse Ruth was told to apprentice him to become a pilot. She heard the word incorrectly and apprenticed him to a band of pirates, remaining with them Herself as a maid-of-all-work. Although Frederic loathed the trade to which he had been bound, He dutifully served. As the curtain rises, his indentures are almost up and he is preparing to Leave the band and devote himself to the extermination of piracy.

He urges the pirates to join him in a more lawful calling, but they refuse. Ruth, however, wants to become his wife. Having seen few women, he does not know whether she is really as pretty as she says she is, but he finally consents to take her. A group of girls, all wards of Major-General Stanley, happen upon the scene. Frederic sees their beauty — and Ruth's plainness — and renounces her. Of these girls, Mabel takes a Particular interest in Frederic, and he in her. The other girls are seized by the pirates and threatened with immediate marriage. When the Major-General arrives, he can dissuade the Pirates only by a ruse: he tells them that he is an orphan. Working on their sympathies, they let Him and his wards go free.

INTERMISSION

During the ensuing days and nights, this lie troubles the Major-General's conscience. He sits Brooding over it at night in the courtyard of his estate. He is consoled by this wards' sympathy And Frederic's plan to immediately lead a band of police against the pirates.

Meanwhile, the Pirate King and Ruth seek out Frederic. They have discovered that his Indentures were to run until his twenty-first birthday, and – as he was born on February 29 – he Has really had as yet only five birthdays. Obeying the dictates of his strong sense of duty, Frederic rejoins the pirates. He tells them of the Major-General's deception, and they seize the Major-General.

But the police come to the rescue and charge the pirates to yield "in Queen Victoria's name." This they do. But Ruth explains that these men who appear to be lawless pirates are really all Noblemen who have gone wrong. They are pardoned and permitted to marry the Major-General's wards.

Principal Artists



Stephen Ash (Frederic) debuts with FCO. He recently performed Almaviva in *The Barber of Seville in Texas* with Houston Grand Opera's *Opera To Go!*, Frederic in *The Pirates of Penzance* with Heartland Opera Theater, and Jeník in *The Bartered Bride* at the University of Houston Moores Opera Center. The Houston-based tenor earned a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor where he

studied music education and voice performance, and Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from the University of Houston.

Caroline Goodwin (Mabel) makes her FCO debut. This past summer, she sang nine productions with the College Light Opera Company on Cape Cod, where she performed Elsie in *Yeoman of the Guard*, Valencienne in *The Merry Widow*, and the The Plaintiff in *Trial by Jury*. The Indiana University graduate is active in new music. In April of 2021, she commissioned and premiered *A Few Figs from Thistles*, a song



cycle by Alex Tedrow based on the poems of Edna St. Vincent Millay. In 2022, she attended the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria.



Tyler Putnam (Pirate King) is pleased to return to First Coast Opera after performing the roles of Falke in *Die Fledermaus*, The Marquis in *La Traviata*, Mr. Cox in *Cox & Box/Penelope Ann's Revenge* and Dick Deadeye in *H.M.S. Pinafore*. Last summer, Tyler made his European opera debut singing Sparafucile and Monterone in *Rigoletto* with Opera på Skäret, Sweden, and he returns there this summer to sing

Oroveso in *Norma*. Recent performances include *Cura Viejo* in the world premiere of *Behold the Man* with Opera Las Vegas, Leporello in *Don Giovanni* with Gulfshore Opera, and Oroveso in *Norma* with Opera Tampa for which he received an award from Theatre Tampa Bay. Tyler Putnam grew up on Chebeague Island, Maine, and is a graduate of Dartmouth College.

Sarah Nordin (Ruth) has been featured in recent seasons as Rosina in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* with Opera Orlando and Gulf Coast Symphony as well as the title role in *La Cenerentola* with Geneva Light Opera. First Coast Opera fans will recognize her from her roles of Orlofsky in *Die Fledermaus*, Flora in *La Traviata*, Lydia in *Penelope Ann's Revenge* and Buttercup in *H.M.S. Pinafore*. Her favorite classic Musical Theater roles



performed are Nellie in *South Pacific*, Maria in *Sound of Music*, Sandy in *Grease* and Tzeitel in *Fiddler on the Roof*. Ms. Nordin is also an award-winning ballroom dancer and an accomplished french horn player.



Curtis Tucker (Major General Stanley) celebrates his tenth season as General and Artistic Director with First Coast Opera. During his tenure, the company has expanded its performances and been recognized as a Professional Company Member of Opera America. This season he directed *Copland's America*, conducted *La Bohème*, and now sings Major General Stanley. Elsewhere, he has led concerts and productions for

Cincinnati Opera, Opera Memphis, Opera Saratoga, Syracuse Opera, Mobile Opera, Amelia Island Opera, and the University of North Florida. His original family opera, *The Trial of B. B. Wolf*, was performed at the annual conference of the National Opera Association, and First Coast Opera will perform his opera *The Stranger's Tale* during the upcoming Romanza in May.

Jason Whitfield (Sergeant of Police) moved to Saint
Augustine with his wife and three sons after living in New
York for fifteen years. He was recently seen as Frank in *Die*Fledermaus and Bouncer in Cox and Box with First Coast
Opera. He also musical directed and played Burl Sanders in
Smoke on the Mountain locally this past season. He still



performs with the New York Gilbert and Sullivan Players (NYGASP), and favorite roles include Colonel Calverley in *Patience* and Bill Bobstay in *H.M.S Pinafore*. Some favorite Musical Theater roles are Frank Butler in *Annie Get Your Gun* and Cornelius Hackl in *Hello, Dolly*. He continues to sing with the all-male group FIGARO and croons with the all-female group The Manhattan Dolls.



Noah Peacock (Samuel) is pleased to return to First Coast Opera after previous ensemble roles in *Le Nozze di Figaro* and *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. Assorted theatre performances include Gus Esmond Jr. in *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* at Thin Air Theatre Company and Peter Shaw in *Silent Sky* at The University of West Florida. His most recent work is with Hershey Park in Hershey, Pennsylvania working at the second

season of Dark Nights. Peacock grew up in Florahome, Florida and got his degrees (A.A, A.S, B.F.A) from St. John's River State College, Florida School of the Arts, and The University of West Florida.

Hope M. Cruse (Edith), a Saint Augustine native, is a Junior at the University of Florida. She has been a mainstay with First Coast Opera since 2017. Ms. Cruse was a featured as a young maiden in *Le Nozze di Figaro* and performed opposite Maestro Curtis Tucker in *A Life in Song; A Cabaret*. Other performed roles include Laurey in *Oklahoma!* and Eliza Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*.





Caragh Zeigler (Kate) is thrilled to be back performing with First Coast Opera. Her last production was last season's *Die Fledermaus* as an ensemble member. Since then, she has performed with Kristin Chenoweth in concert with the Naples Philharmonic Orchestra. She is a YoungArts 2024 Theater/Musical winner and is a home-schooled senior.

Annabelle's Wellschlager (Isabel) debuts with First Coast Opera. Recent roles include Maria von Trapp in *The Sound of Music*, Ariel in *The Little Mermaid*, and Laurey in *Oklahoma!*. This Spring she will perform Elle Woods in Beachside High's *Legally Blonde*. Annabelle looks forward to continuing her music career by majoring in vocal performance.



Artistic Team



Clifford Parrish (Conductor) has conducted numerous shows for community, high school, and college theaters. He was awarded for Outstanding Stage Direction and Music Direction for 1776 by the New Jersey Association of Community Theaters, and for music direction for Sweeney Todd and Secret Garden. Favorite shows include A Man of No Importance, A Light in the Piazza, Nine, Fiddler on the

Roof, and *Titanic.* A lifelong church musician, he is currently serving as organist/choirmaster at Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd, Jacksonville. He holds a BME degree from Jacksonville University (where he performed in *Pirates*!) and a MM in conducting from Westminster Choir College.

Nelson Sheeley (Stage Director) has worked in professional theatre and opera since 1970, acting, directing, and stage managing. For ten years he served as Managing Director of Allenberry Playhouse, where he directed over 90 productions of plays, musicals and operettas. He has directed several FCO productions, as well as for Opera Saratoga, The Liederkranz Society, The National Opera Company, Whitewater and Sorg Operas, Opera Naples,



Nevada Opera, and the Orchestra of St. Luke's. Author of works in many genres, he has collaborated on three operas with Curtis Tucker including *Penelope Ann's Revenge, The Stranger's Tale* and *The Trial of B. B. Wolf.* A graduate of the Yale School of Drama, he currently teaches and resides in Dayton, Ohio.



In The Moment Arts Collective (Set Construction) Stephen and Jessica are a St. Augustine couple specializing in theatrical and visual arts. They have designed and crafted theatrical sets, props, puppets, museum exhibits, costumes, scripts, haunts, lighting, and sound design, including FCO's own *H.M.S. 




